Active Transportation Update



Coles Associates

Construction has officially begun for the Abegweit Active Transportation Centre and Cultural Grounds, located along the Hillsborough River on the right-hand side of Route 2, across from the Scotchfort Reserve. The Centre will serve as a respite and storage facility while providing rental access to recreational equipment such as bicycles, e-bikes, etc. to be used on multi-use pathways that will connect to the Confederation trail system. The site will enhance the community's connection to active transportation opportunities, invite visitors to learn about the history of the Mi'kmaq culture, while also fostering connections with surrounding communities and water pathways.
