

## Community Recreation Centre Update



Interior and exterior design renderings have been finalized for Phase 2, the Community Recreation Centre. This work was completed by Nine Yards and Architecture49, who are now focused on preparing construction documents to ensure the project is shovel ready by Spring 2026. These renderings highlight key features of the Centre - the building's footprint, the Olympic-sized gymnasium with a walking track, the exercise and weight room, and the central community hub with natural lighting, millwork and a fireplace.

## Solar Project Update

- Provide **energy to community buildings**, including back-up during outages.
- Transition to a **sustainable energy solution**.
- Generate profit from the **sale of clean energy to the grid to reinvest in community**.
- Support Abegweit's **goal to invest in renewable energy**. (Abegweit First Nation Comprehensive Community Plan, 2018)


